


## **General Nash Geography Bee**

### **Nurse's Notes**

Here are a few tips for flu and cold season:

Wash your hands frequently; to prevent the spread of cold and flu viruses. Remember to drink at 8 glasses of water each day. Not only does water help to keep you hydrated, it also helps to 'flush out' the germs. It can also prevent headaches and muscle aches. Remember eating at least 5-a-day of fruits and vegetables also helps to keep you healthy.

Please send in Physical forms for students who attend Kindergarten/First, or  $6^{th}$  grade. Also, please send Dental forms for students in Kindergarten/First or  $3^{rd}$  grade.

The Physicals and Dentals are mandated by PA state. If you have a child in another grade, and we do not have any Physicals or Dental forms, please submit as soon as possible.

- 1) Please notify the office if there any changes of your phone numbers or emergency contacts.
- 2) Remember to send cough drops to school with a written note. Your child should bring the cough drops and the note directly to the Nurse's Office. Should the cough last longer than 1 week, please consult your health care provider. We can only keep cough drops and other over the counter medications for 3 weeks, after that the district requires a doctor's note.

<u>Vaccinations requirements are as follows</u>: All students entering grade 7 will need to have a #2 Varicella, a Tdap, and a Meningitis vaccination. Grade 7 students who have not had these vaccinations or a signed exemption will be excluded from school in September. Any time your child receives an immunization/vaccination please provide the school with a copy of this documentation.

Thank you in advance for your help in keeping your child's health record up to date.


