Dear Parents or Guardians:

This is an important letter to update you about changes in the elementary mathematics curriculum. New math materials were introduced in kindergarten through third grade in September 2013, and are being rolled out to fourth through sixth grade students this September.

A committee of various elementary school stakeholders from the North Penn School District reviewed and developed a new mathematics curriculum aligned to the PA Core Standards. These standards articulate new expectations for student knowledge and skills in mathematics. The committee reviewed a variety of publisher-created texts and resources to support the curriculum. When reviewing the different resources, the committee evaluated how well each resource was aligned to the new PA Core Standards, the features and design of the materials, the teacher support materials, the student and family resources and the assessments. After completing the material review, it was determined that the best fit for the new mathematics curriculum framework was the *Go Math!* resource.

The Go Math! materials were created after the Common Core State Standards were released and specifically built to best meet the new expectations for students' knowledge and skills in mathematics. Go Math! emphasizes the critical areas and depth of understanding through interactive lessons, research based instructional approaches, best practices from around the world, and differentiated instructional resources to ensure success for all students. Instead of the traditional hardbound student textbook, the Go Math! resource utilizes consumable workbooks, which allows students to record, represent, solve and explain as they discover and build new understandings. Other features of Go Math! include Differentiated Center Kits, resources for Response to Instruction and Intervention (RtII), an Assessment Guide, and robust online materials and resources for students, parents and teachers. The parent and student online resources include access to the students' Standards Practice Book, animated math models and virtual manipulatives.

If you are interested in more information about the new elementary math curriculum or *Go Math!* materials, we invite you to join us for Parent Math Nights. Each Parent Math Night is targeted to a specific grade level, but you are welcome to come any evening. All sessions will be held in the auditorium at Inglewood Elementary School, located at 1313 Allentown Rd. in Lansdale, from 7:00 to 8:00 PM. Sessions are scheduled as follows:




