Go to the North Penn website - www.npenn.org and click on the Community Bulletin Board (which is updated around the 1st and the 15th of each month) to find all the information on upcoming community events, sport camps, etc. Then sign up for the e-alert – so you can stay informed.

- 1. Sign in to the website. Note: You must be a registered user to sign in. (If you are not already registered, then please select the **Register** button from the upper toolbar on the NPSD website and follow the steps indicated.)
 - 2. After registering and signing in, click on the Access My Info button on the right side of the upper toolbar.
- 3. Once selected, the My Profile tab will display at the top of the webpage, and the My E-Alerts & Subscriptions tab will display at the bottom.
- 4. Click the Edit Subscriptions button and then place a checkmark in the Community Bulletin Board selection box located under the heading <u>"For Families."</u>
 5. Scroll to the bottom of the webpage and click the **Subscribe** button.

 - 6. Once you subscribe, you will begin receiving e-mail notices whenever the content has been updated on the Community Bulletin Board site.
